THE MISSING FOUND is an investigative true crime podcast focused on the unsolved and cold missing person cases in the Black community, through case profiling and conducting analyses.

THE WHY

THE MISSING FOUND was developed in 2022, out of discontentment of not getting the much needed attention our cases require - that all missing people require. You're looking at an over decade long amount of heart and soul for wanting to make change.

We know every case won't receive heightened coverage, but in our community, our missing people tend to be left cold and forgotten. I'm here to tell a story; to let families and their loved one who's missing know that they're unforgotten, we care, and we're still looking for them.

THE METHODOLOGY

Harlow's approach has always been focused on research, understanding the life of our missing person, where they came from, their family dynamic, their inner circle, their personality, and their movements thereafter. Harlow prides herself on delivering full case analyses to fully understand the case from a unique angle than just them being missing. People want to know the details, even the smallest details and scenarios that are often missed or just aren't considered. Harlow is willing to take it there. She is willing to go beyond the surface and thoroughly profile the case starting from the top and analyze the intricate details in between.

Harlow's methodology has always been to start with sharing a brief of the missing, relate their story back to life to connect our audience to our victim to communicate that their story can happen to any of us, develop comprehensive long-form details on the case, analyze every public fact that we have, possible theories, final thoughts, and information on how to find our missing person. We always close with a scripture to offer hope, faith, and direction for missing individuals and their families. Only God, Himself, can bring forth the answers we need.

Combined with her expertise in investigative writing, storytelling, and studying journalism at University of California, Berkeley, Harlow is ready to embark on this new journey to finding our missing and doing it in decency; with an investigative intellectual approach, direction, and hope through faith.



WHEN DID 'THE MISSING FOUND' BEGIN

I wrote and published my first case analysis on June 28, 2022. My first case analysis was published in video format, on YouTube, on November 20, 2022.

WHY IS THE PLATFORM CALLED "THE MISSING FOUND" WHEN JADYN ONLY COVERS **MISSING PEOPLE AND NO ONE HAS BEEN FOUND?**

The reason I share these stories is so that they can be found. Whether they're found alive or deceased, the family needs answers. The cases that I cover, primarily, are unsolved and freezing cold. Their stories are always "found" on my platform. I'm covering cases that no one else is covering, and often forgotten. I want the family and those closest to the missing person to know they're unforgotten, we care, and we're still looking.

So far, one case that I did cover, Case Episode 6 of Delano Burkes, he was found. He was found deceased, however, his story was pushed out there and in the media rotation. pan unsolved

WHAT IS YOUR OLDEST CASE?

My oldest case is nearly 50 years old. It was Case Episode 21 of Jennifer Barton.

WHY DON'T YOU COVER MURDER CASES?

I've always stood firm on not covering murder cases. I choose not to because the answer is simple, it's just too much for my heart to bear. I know my limits, and to analyze a murder case is beyond my limit.

Maybe one day I will cover murder, just not today or tomorrow.

WHY DON'T YOU DISCUSS CASES OF OTHER RACES?

It's not that I refuse to analyze cases that are of other races, it's just that I want to focus on my community first since we have a high missing person rate in America of people that are unaccounted for, and don't receive enough coverage opposed to our counterparts.

I want to make it clear that ALL missing people deserve coverage. Before 'The Missing Found', I've requested specific cases to be covered that are of Black people on other popular and unpopular podcasts, but it has been years and they never covered it, and still have not. I decided to create my own platform so I don't have to ask and plead. Instead, I cover it myself. I created my own table. I have to take care of home first, then I can look at other cases.


